

CIMB e-Invoicing Customers Guide to Retrieve Tourism Tax Registration Number

Purpose of Document

1. **Effective 1 July 2025**, customers who wish to receive e-Invoice from CIMB are encouraged to provide their **e-Invoicing details**, including their **Tax Identification Number (“TIN”)** and **SST Registration Number**. These details are required to ensure a smooth and efficient e-invoicing process, in compliance with regulatory requirements.
2. To facilitate this transition, CIMB has prepared a **simple, step-by-step guide** to assist customers in retrieving the following information:
 - **Tourism Tax Registration Number**

What is Tourism Tax Registration Number?

- **Tourism Tax Registration Number (TTx)** is a unique identifier assigned to business registered under Tourism Tax (TT) scheme in Malaysia.



What if I do not have a Tourism Tax Registration Number?

- **The TTx number is only applicable to businesses involved in tourism-related activities.**
- If you are **not** registered for Tourism Tax, you may leave the field **blank** when providing your e-Invoice information to CIMB.

How do customers find their Tourism Tax Registration Number?

You can retrieve your Tourism Tax Registration Number (TTx) through:

- Login to MyTTx Portal
- Find your business code in the Tourism Tax tab


